Riviera Garden Club-The 70's-An Interview with Irma Maggio

In the 1970's, most of the RGC's

members were young

housewives.

According to long time member Irma Maggio, The Riviera Garden Club was a much different club in the 1970's than it is today. Most of the members were young housewives. There were additional small garden clubs in the Costa Verde District (CVD) and they had more interclub activities in those years. The smaller clubs met in member's homes, but the CVD met at the South Coast Botanic Garden. Some of the garden clubs, including the Riviera Garden Club, restricted their membership to certain geographical areas.

The focus of those early garden clubs was much more on flower arranging. Two ladies from the Costa Verde District, Helen Gates (101 years

old) and Ester Stough, were the flower show judges; and they were the people to please. Irma explained that one of the favorite types of flower show in those years was called a placement show. This when a committee selected locations at one member's home and other club members arranged flowers for those places or locations. Another favorite activity was a type of show where garden members worked club coordination with the South Bay Watercolor Society to make floral arrangements to highlight various in theSociety's paintings exhibitions.

According to long time member Irma Maggio, The Riviera Garden Club sponsored bridge luncheons in the 1970's but that activity gradually changed the members were young housewives. There were additional small garden clubs in the Costa Verde District (CVD) and they had activities besides RGC. In the 1970's Irma returned to college, first to El Camino and then to Cal State

Irma told us that two highly respected long-time RGC members and past presidents, Edith Dees and Nadyne Sheldon, were active in the 70's but sadly they are now deceased. Our own Nan Clancy and Toni Sargent were also members in

those early years. They both took a hiatus from RGC and are currently second time around members.

Included is some biographical

information about RGC member and her Irma Maggio. Irma husband Tony came to California in 1950 from Haverhill, Massachusetts. When Irma joined the Riviera Garden Club, she enjoyed meeting new people plus she enjoyed the sociability of the club's young members. Irma soon developed her interest in flower arranging as well as judging and attending large flower shows. One of these district level flower shows was called Fiesta del Flores. She also became active in extending the membership boundaries of RGC lessening the district's influence on local activities. Irma was involved with many other

RGC. The themed Redondo Beach. The Maggio and mid-60's. In the 1970's Irma Camino and then to Cal State Dominguez Hills where she earned a degree in art history. Irma also volunteered at Banning House and the Torrance Art Museum. Torrance Art Museum recently had a show that was co-curated by one of her granddaughters. Originally Irma Maggio lived with her family on Paseo de las Tortugas. Later she moved to Village Palos Verdes. Today Irma Maggio is a resident of New Horizons in Torrance. Even after all these years of living in California, Irma still speaks with her charming eastern Massachusetts Boston accent.

Irma Maggio joined the Riviera Garden Club in 1967, was president in 1970-71 and was promoted to the status of RGC Honorary Member in 2010. Our beloved Irma Maggio has remained a valuable member of and has continued to stay involved with the Riviera Garden Club for almost 50 years.
