STORMWATER BASIN ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM AT ENTRADERO PARK By Marilyn Rubin

What is Entradero Park?

Entradero Park is the largest of Torrance's 17 rainwater catch basins or sumps. In the 1950's Torrance was known as "The City of Sumps". The improvements at Entradero Park are fine examples of Torrance's **Stormwater Basin Enhancement Program**. This park has ball fields, playgrounds, a stone BarBQ, picnic areas, a hospitable environment for local wildlife, walking trails PLUS the *now* pristine catch basin filled with resident and migratory birds.

Torrance's Stormwater Basin Enhancement Basin Project Benefits:

- Stormwater treatment through natural systems and infiltration basins
- Reduced debris into storm drains/ocean by use of curbside trash screens.
- Habitat restoration
- Enhanced public viewing areas
- Naturalized walking trails
- Groundwater recharging
- Improved landscaping and aesthetics
- Water conservation through use of recycled water (the purple pipes)

Where is Entradero Park? Drive north on Anza Ave. to Towers St. Towers St. is between Del Amo and 190th street. Turn left on Towers. Pass Entradero. Turn into the park.
