REMEMBERING NANCY WEAVER

Some of the information was found in Nancy's Celebration of Life Pamphlet.

Nancy was born in Indiana and graduated from Indiana University in 1968 and remained a life-long Hoosier even though she moved to California where she earned a master's degree at UC Santa Barbara. Nancy taught 4th grade at Bonita Street School in the LA Unified School District. Throughout her 33 year teaching career and even after retiring, she remained committed to supporting public education institutions. In 1969 Nancy met Howard, the love of her life. They were married in 1970 and moved to their Torrance home in 1973. Nancy and Howard shared many interests: jazz, skiing, tennis, bicycling, camping, sailing, gardening and driving their vintage Porsche as well as entertaining. Nancy lost Howard in 2009 and it took her many years to recover from her loss. She persevered and eventually resumed old friendships and formed new ones. Nancy worked hard but also knew how to balance her life with fun and enjoyment.

Nancy Weaver was co-president of the Riviera Garden Club from 2012-2014 with Geneva Martin. Nancy often hosted RGC board meetings at her home and held other offices during the years she was a member. Nancy's sudden death on January 29 brought shock and sadness to the members of our garden club. She was loved and respected by all.

A \$1000 memorial scholarship has been created by donations from the Riviera Garden Club members to honor our friend, **Nancy Weaver.**



EL CAMINO COLLEGE WARRIOR FOOD PANTRY

The El Camino College (ECC) Warrior Pantry was established to help ECC students who face serious financial challenges, and often find it difficult to support themselves while also paying for college. Research indicates that students without proper nutrition can have trouble focusing on school work and often worry about where they will find their next meal. The Warrior Pantry assists students facing food insecurity. It also provides toiletries, offers access to a computer, and connect students to additional resources in an environment that is supportive and judgement-free. These services can be used by all currently enrolled El Camino College students needing assistance.
