Marilyn pristinely weeds and maintains their water-wise yard. The Rubin family has lived on Greenmeadows Ave for 42 years; and has landscaped the front and rear vards, rear easement hill and inner brick courtyard 3 times over the decades. On June 30 Marilyn and Sherwin Rubin celebrated 50 years of marriage.

## **SEASIDE HEROES PARK**

Realtor Jenna Christensen is organizing a weeding event at SEASIDE HEROES PARK on Saturday July 14. DO COME AND HELP! The east end of the park is located on Anza Ave. at Lomita Blvd. The west side of the park is tucked into the Seaside neighborhood at 22812 Kathryn Ave. Below is a brief history of this tiny charming Torrance park.

The area where today you will find **Seaside Heroes Park** was for over half a century a patch of dirt 2 blocks long where Lomita Blvd *might* have continued into the Seaside neighborhood when you cross Anza going West. It was an eye sore and residents repeatedly petitioned the city for a park. Finally, the City of Torrance and a group of passionate home owners worked together; and the park was unveiled on Jan. 20, 2011. Its name, **Seaside Heroes Park**, is a tribute to three local boys, (South High School graduates) who lost their lives in the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan.



Jenna Christensen (above) who now heads the monthly weeding work parties) lives in the neighborhood and noticed problems as she walked her dog at Seaside Heroes Park. These are Jenna's quotes: "When I walked through the park in early spring of 2014, dead flower heads and weeds galore greeted me, and I decided something had to be done. We could not wait for the city to take action." Via the mother of one of the fallen soldiers, in honor of whom the park was named, 65 teenagers from a local church came to help on April 26th. The city of Torrance had a truck and a driver available to haul away the bags full of weeds. That driver made 7 trips!



Seaside Heroes Park is dog, child, and adult friendly. However, the park contains NO **BATHROOMS** and there is NO POTABLE **DRINKING WATER AVAILABLE.** The park draws a steady stream of visitors who enjoy all aspects of the space. Water-wise landscape is used throughout the park and irrigation is with recycled water. The downside of recycled water (those purple pipes) is that it contains a large amount of toxins which act as fertilizer. Unfortunately, that stimulates the growth of weeds. Therefore, to maintain the tidiness and charm of this tiny park, SEASIDE HEROES PARK hosts WEEDING AND BEAUTIFICATION EVENTS that take place the 2<sup>ND</sup> SATURDAY OF EACH MONTH 8 to 11 a.m. organized by local real estate agent Jenna Christensen.


